



The Future of Children is a collaboration of the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University and the Brookings Institution. Our mission is to translate the best social science research about children and youth into information that is useful to policymakers, practitioners, grant-makers, advocates, the media, and students of public policy. We publish two journals and policy briefs each year, and we coordinate a variety of related outreach events. Topics range widely—from income policy to family issues to education to health—with children’s policy as the unifying element.

Because *The Future of Children* aims to reach a wide audience with the best objective research possible, our articles are literature reviews. They provide a balanced view of the evidence, review both basic and “policy-relevant” research, and avoid using overly technical language. The project also supports numerous activities and conferences and an active website, including a blog and webcasts of many of our outreach presentations. In keeping with our commitment to reach a broad audience, electronic versions of our materials and attendance at our outreach forums are free of charge. Print copies of the journal are often provided at no cost at our outreach events, and are available for sale on our website.

The senior editorial team represents two institutions and multiple disciplines. Editor-in-Chief Sara McLanahan is the Director of the Center for Research on Child Wellbeing and the William S. Tod Professor of Sociology and Public Affairs at Princeton University. Senior editors include Ron Haskins, Senior Fellow and Co-Director of the Center on Children and Families at the Brookings Institution, and a senior consultant at the Annie E. Casey Foundation; Cecilia Rouse, Dean of the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs, Katzman-Ernst Professor in the Economics of Education and Professor of Economics and Public Affairs at Princeton University; Janet Currie, Director of the Center for Health and Wellbeing and Henry Putnam Professor of Economics and Public Affairs at Princeton University; and Isabel Sawhill, Senior Fellow, Co-Director of the Center on Children and Families and Cabot Family Chair at the Brookings Institution. *The Future of Children* is supported by staff at both Princeton and Brookings. Associate Editor Kris McDonald and Managing Editor Jon Wallace oversee the project; Lisa Markman-Pithers and Reid Quade organize outreach activities; and Regina Leidy coordinates communications.
